YOUR PALM SPRINGS LIBRARY: THERE'S AN APP FOR THAT!

Want to renew a book or place one on hold? There's an app

for that. Library hours or location? There's an app for that. Download an ebook? Find information fast? There's an app for that, too.

The Library has recently launched a mobile app to put the library at your fingertips. From any smart phone or tablet connected to the internet you can instantly tap into library resources, anytime, anywhere. You can search the



library catalog, check your account, find events and more.

To access the library's mobile app, search Palm Springs Public Library in your smart phone, web-enabled mobile device, or tablet's marketplace and download the FREE app.

Searching the catalog with the mobile app is especially easy. Just type the first few letters of two or three words and search results will begin to appear. For example, if you're looking up Mark Twain in the catalog, just type "ma twa." Once you find the title you're looking for, you can place it on hold right from your phone.

Other features include BookLook Mobile that lets you scan an ISBN barcode anywhere you are to see if the library owns the title. "This is an amazing feature," says Jeannie Kays. "If you're at a bookstore you can just scan the ISBN, see if we own it and—if we do—place a hold on it right from your phone."


DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: Summer Reading Program

Before you know it, summer will be here and that means SUMMER READING! This year's theme is PAWS to Read. We think the theme will be a lot of fun with all sorts of activities going to the dogs. We have a full lineup of events planned for children,



teens, and even adults. Adult programs will take place mostly on Tuesdays, children's programs will happen on Wednesdays and teen activities will take place on Thursdays.

Our official launch is the week of June 9, though the teens are starting early on June 5. Children and teens have the opportunity to earn up to three free books during the summer.



Every child or teen who visits the library four weeks during the eight week program will earn a free book. The go-getters who visit all eight weeks earn two books during the program. Additionally, every child or teen who reads just five books during the program will earn a free book. It has been

said that if a child reads just FIVE books during the summer, he or she avoids the "summer slide" in reading achievement.

To make the program extra rewarding, participants have the chance to win one of three grand prize Samsung Galaxy Tablets, courtesy of the Friends of the Palm Springs Library. The Friends have generously agreed to donate \$5,000 toward the Summer Reading Program, which will pay for the grand prizes, free books for children and teens, and some of our performers.

Last year we received many generous donations from the community and we hope to seek out donations again this year. If you or your organization would like to contribute, please contact the library. Donations are recognized in promotional posters, on our website and announced during events. If you would like to donate your time, we are working with the Friends of the Library volunteer coordinator to set up a schedule for helpers.

Giving away free books from the Friends, sponsoring our performers, and sponsoring the grand prizes puts the Friends of the Palm Springs Library in the spotlight as we are able to show how every donation to the library makes a difference, especially to the children who earn free books and are able to attendfirst-rate programs at no charge. We think that our Summer Reading Program, PAWS to Read will have you wagging your tail, rolling over, and begging for more. Put on your Hush Puppies and get to the library this summer. You'll be running with the big dogs in no time!



ANNUAL MEETING: JUMPING THE FENCE



Friends' members who attended the Annual Meeting were on the edges of their seats listening to local author Maureen Gilmer recount her twenty-year search for her family's roots for her book Jumping the Fence. This phrase refers to southern (particularly New Orleans) people of color who were able to "pass" as whites during the last half of the 19th century. Maureen's search was hampered by her family's reluctance to talk about it. She donated two copies of her book to the Library. It will also be available on the Hot Off the Press kiosks.



President Chris Seidel chaired a brief business meeting. He called for motions to approve the renewal of four members of the Board for threeyear terms: Sheila Grattan, LeeOna Hostrop, Marie Weigel, and Ralph Thornton.

Treasurer Mike Thompson reported that the Friends' operating bank balance is \$25,828, up from \$21,828 last year. Our CD account remains intact to be used for the renovation

of the Library. We spent \$4,180 for Public Relations in 2013, which includes our website, a new banner, and advertising.

He added that the Friends gave a total of \$35,136 in gifts to the Library.
