■ To Board Member Wanda Turman for organizing our 2016 Annual Meeting.

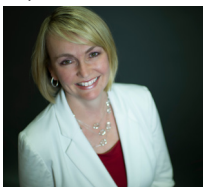

SUMMER READING AT THE LIBRARY



This year's Summer Reading theme was "Read to the Rhythm." We enjoyed several different musical performances, a puppet show, a magic show, various craft and trivia programs, lectures about the history of Rock 'n' Roll and Native American Bird Singing and Dancing. We also screened a variety of movie musicals, including a Frozen sing-a-long with over 200 little Elsas and Olafs singing their hearts out!

Registrations of youth, teens and adults totaled 952 this year and 2,650 people attended our 51 programs during the 8-week session. Overall registrations were up 28% over last year! Through the support of our Friends of the Palm Springs Library we were able to award three XBOX 360 Kinect systems as our grand prizes, one for each age group. Through their generous donation of \$5,000 we not only were able to purchase the grand prizes but also needed supplies and several hundred books to giveaway to those youth and teens that came to the library every week for at least 4 weeks or more!

Along with the Friends of the Palm Springs Library other sponsors included US Bank who donated \$2,500 toward our programs, and several other local businesses and organizations that supplied items, gift certificates and gift cards that were given away each week. FRIENDS VOLUNTEERS HELP BORN TO READ PROGRAM



The Born to Read Program is now up and running thanks to the volunteers who assembled over 300 gift bags to give to the parents of newborns at Desert Regional Medical Center. The bags were given to Healthy Beginnings, a group that works with the hospital. They conduct classes for parents of newborns. So far they have given out 39 bags during their tours, 24 during the classes, and 19 to walk-in patients.

Patients who don't attend the classes are given a voucher for a bag in their take-home folder. These vouchers can be picked up at a class or at the Library. One voucher was claimed at the Library.

NEW MARKETING AVENUE FOR THE FRIENDS

Friends Board Member Richard Ellis and other Board Members approached a local business, Destination PSP, to develop a line of unique, fun and trendy merchandise to sell at their store and at Friends events to raise funds and awareness about the Library and the Friends. With the help of Library Director, a request was submitted to the City Council to use the name 'Palm Springs Public Library' on the merchandise which received approval at the October 7th meeting.



In the meantime, and to test the public's interest, the Friends had Destination PSP create a test item without the name to have in store at their inaugural week long 'Just Cause' event in September which gave an additional donation equal to 10% of the purchase price to the non-profit of the shopper's choice, in addition to the percentage received on the branded merchandise sold. The item they designed was an eye/sun glass case and it had fun graphics with the tag line 'Palm Springs Is For Readers'. It has been a hit and they have sold many cases. So, with the approval to use the Library name we will be off and running creating other merchandise to have available just in time for holiday shopping!

Their store is located in downtown Palm Springs at 170 North Palm Canyon (between Tahquitz & Andreas), look for the Friends of the Palm Springs Library display!
