




The events committee is busy putting together fun and interesting events for the upcoming season. Save the dates and enjoy everything your local library group of friends has to offer this season:

Thursday, June 23rd was David Gray's final Trustee Board



Meeting. After eight years of service, his term has expired. Not only has he devoted long hours to the work of a Trustee, but he is a long-time volunteer for our events and book sales and has worked tirelessly as an advocate for the Library.

The meeting was held at the newly-renovated Welwood Murray Memorial Library, a project to which the Trustees devoted many

long years to complete. In addition to praising our Friends organization, David discussed the many accomplishments that he has participated in as a Trustee: creation of their bylaws; hiring our new Library Director Jeannie Kays; seeing a new roof installed on the Library building; hiring an architect

to create conceptual plans for a major renovation of the Library; and just recently, seeing the City Council, led by Council Library Committee members Mayor Moon and Councilman Mills, approve \$500,000 for renovation plans.

To mark his resignation, David has commissioned Yucca Valley artist, CarmenTostado,tocreatea"BookArt"sculp-



ture entitled "Palm Springs Holiday." It will be on permanent display in the Welwood lobby. It commemorates the 75th anniversary of the Welwood Murray Memorial Library building.




